Born in Seoul, South Korea, Yonah Martin (Kim) immigrated to Canada in 1972. Since 2009, following an exemplary teaching career and extensive community activism, Senator Yonah Martin representing British Columbia, became the first Canadian of Korean descent to serve in the Senate of Canada, and the first Korean-Canadian parliamentarian in Canadian history. Senator Martin has been honoured many times by both the Canadian & Korean Governments for her outstanding work for Veterans. Closing Remarks - Major (Ret'd) Don Kennedy and Dann Oliver

Dear Korean War Veterans, Family members and Friends,

It was our pleasure to organize and fund the "Complimentary Veterans Appreciation Luncheon", "Meet and Greet Canadian Senator Yonah Martin" and "Ambassador for Peace Medal Presentation" in partnership with the Royal Canadian Legion Post 144 Pinellas County (celebrating 77 th year in Clearwater, Florida), American Legion Post 7 Clearwater and the Korean War Veterans Association Sunshine State Chapter 159 at the American Legion Post 7 on March 25th, 2019.

This special event began with warm a welcome from Dann Oliver, RCL Post 144 Commander and blessing by Lt. Col (Ret'd) Bill Slavins at 12:30 P.M. The delicious chicken luncheon for 70 guests were prepared by Nauti Nanci's kitchen. American, Korean, Canadian, National Anthems were played after the colour party placed their flags (American, Canadian, Korean, United Nations).

Peter Palmer, President the KWVA Sunshine Chapter and Judi Michaud, a member of KWVA Chapter 159 kindly brought the most beautiful "Ambassador for Peace Medal" cake as a desert. Senator Yonah Martin cut the cake and served it to the guests with the help of Canadian Volunteers, Pat Jones and Tom Kelly.

Major (Ret'd) Don Kennedy who was a Master of Ceremony explained the significance of the Ambassador for Peace Medal which is issued by the Republic of Korea to honour the Korean War Veterans who served during the Korean War (June 25, 1950 – July 27, 1953) and the UN Peace Keeping Mission (till January 31, 1955).

There were 3 video presentations ("Thank you USA", "Canadians Our Heroes", Last Ship in the Hobour"). He read the special greeting letter from Congressman, Ross Spano, Florida District 15.

HooJung Jones Kennedy, past advisor of the Republic of Korea President and the Korea Veterans Association of Canada Unit 26, Project and Fund Raising Director introduced Canadian Senator the Honourable Yonah Martin who is the Deputy Leader of the Opposition in the Senate of Canada. She introduced and helped to pass Bill S - 213 recognizing July 27 as the "Korean War Veterans Day" in Canada.

Honourable Senator Yonah Martin delivered her heartfelt speech to the Korean War Veterans (American, Canadian and UK) and their family members. Gordon Bennett, Vice President and a Canadian Korean War Veteran who fought on Hill 355 and was a past Commander of the RCL Post 144 recited "Act of Remembrance Day" and "Last Post" was played by Chaplain Craig Demes.

There were 8 Ambassador for Peace Medals presented to the 4 killed US Korean War Veterans (James D Bell, John A Smith, Ralph L Merritt, Henry Edsel Ford), 1 Wounded US Korean War Veteran (Ben St. Clair), 1 US Korean Naval Veteran (Anthony Joseph Bazarewsky), 2 Canadian Korean War Veterans family members (Kathy Hunter on behalf of Frank Steers) and (Geraldine and Larry Boudreau on behalf of Norman Joseph Boudreau who joined in US army during the Korean War.

Frank Anderson, a Korean War Veteran is from a small town (400 people) Brocton, Illinois and he with 5 of his high school friends all joined the US Army during the Korean War and 4 of them were killed (one of them received the Silver Star) and 1 was wounded. Frank married a wounded Korean War Veteran's younger sister, Bobbie and he has been carrying the letter from his friend who was killed during the Korean War ever since.

They will display the 5 Ambassador for Peace Medals with the fallen Korean War soldiers photos (some of them do not have grave sites thus, we hope that this will be their resting places) at the American Legion in Brocton, Illinois to honour these brave young men who gave their all.

In mid September, Frank and Bobbie will travel to Korea as part of the "Korea Revisit" Program. It was very emotional and moving ceremony and there were many tears and smiles. We hope that the Korean War Veterans and their family members will have closure and comfort knowing that they are not forgotten.

Senator Yonah Martin presented the 3 beautiful Korean dolls to Peter and Sallie Palmer (President of KWVA Chapter 159), Gordon and Evelyn Bennett (Vice President of KWVA Chapter 159) and Dan and Mary Oliver (RCL Post 144 Commander), Senator Martin also presented authentic copies of the Bill S-213 to the Korean War Veterans. Her husband, Doug Martin helped to present the special gifts (Korean Fans, Korean Posters, Korean Calendars from the Korean Tourism Organization) to the Korean War Veterans and their family members.

Senator Martin dedicated a "Sliver star" in honour of "16 UN Korean War Veterans" at the Honour Wall in the American Post 7 Clear Water (This is the first American Legion Post in the US and they are celebrating their 100th Anniversary on November 11th, 2019).

HooJung Jones Kennedy presented commendation letters on behalf of the Congressman Ross Spano to Frank and Bobbie Anderson, Geraldine and Larry Boudreau and Kathy and Dave Hunter. Rob Fleege, Veterans Affairs Liaison for Congressman Gus Bilirakis presented a "Congressional Commendation Certificate" to Anthony Joseph Bazarewsky who served in the US Navy and he received the Korea Service medal with 2 stars and Korean Presidential Citation for his service during the Korean War.

Dann Oliver, RCL Post Commander presented Royal Canadian Legion Post 144 T-shirts to Senator Yonah Martin and her husband Doug Martin. Kathy Hunter's husband, Dave Hunter presented their book "Along Interstate –75" (The Snowbird's bible which has sold 2 million copies in Canada and US) to Senator Martin.





The History of the Royal Canadian Legion Post 144 Pinellas County

The St Petersburg Post 144 Canadian Legion of the British Empire Service League was founded in 1941 with the late Sir Charles and Lady Ross as patrons.

Members of the Post represented many branches of the United States and British Empire Forces and had participated in almost all colonial operations from the time of the Boar War. At that time many members held decorations from both the United States and the British Empire such as:

8 Mons Star 1914-1915
French Legion of Honor
Royal Order of the Serbian White Eagle
Distinguished Flying Crosses (3 British 2 American)
Military Cross (British)
2 Distinguished Conduct Medals(British)
2 Military Medals (British)
Croix de Guerre

The name British Empire Services League was changed in 1958 to the British Commonwealth Ex-Services League (BCEL) and today is a union of some 54 ex-service groups from 48 Commonwealth countries representing around 12 million ex-servicemen and ex-servicewomen. The Royal Canadian Legion is a member of the BCEL.

In 1970 the Post became the Royal Canadian Legion Post 144 Pinellas County.

In 2019, we celebrated the 77th Anniversary!



A BRIEF HISTORY OF AMERICAN LEGION TURNER-BRANDON POST 7 CLEARWATER, FLORIDA

Shortly following the end of World War 1, a group of veterans met on the steps of the County Court House in Clearwater and there planned the formation of an American Legion Post. They chose as a name, Turner-Brandon, in honor of two of Clearwater's sons who gave their lives in defense of our Nation.

The decision to organize an American Legion Post resulted from the conclusion of these Veterans that the American Legion was the representative Veterans' organization in this country. That conclusion has been proven true as today the American Legion is the largest wartime Veterans' organization with nearly 15,000 local Posts throughout America and over 3 million members who care about America, Veterans, their families and our nation's youth.

Edward Campbell Turner, a Seaman 2/C, died at sea while serving aboard the USS Rhode Island. Ian Leroy Brandon served as a Private with the 49th Co., 5th regular Marines, and was killed in action as an advance on Belleau Woods. Both men were of pioneer stock and their family names are represented to this day in civic, governmental, and business fields in Pinellas County and the City of Clearwater.

Having made the choice of a name for the new Post, application was then made for a new Charter. On February 21, 1921, the original Charter was issued and the Post began its existence under the Charter name of Turner-Brandon Post # 7. The Post was incorporated in April of 1959. The first Post Commander was Dr. L. F. Wyatt. We dedicated the original part of our current building in 1964 and in 1975 the lounge addition was completed and dedicated.

For the last 100 years our Post has had an active part in the life of our City and County, endeavoring to carry out the policies and programs recommended by the National and Department Headquarters, keeping ever in mind as a primary objective, the continued welfare of the Veteran and his family.

November 11, marking the exact hour of the cessation of hostility on the war fronts of World War 1.
