**“Train Busting”** - These 8 Canadian Destroyers with a total of 3,621 crew members helped to destroy North Korean supply trains advancing to South Korea during the Korean War and they patrolled the Korean waters during the UN Peace Keeping Mission until 1955. Nine sailors made the supreme sacrifice from 1950 to 1955.

HMCS IROQUOIS served two tours of duty in Korean waters, 1952 and 1953. On October 2, 1952, during her third patrol in Song Jin, North Korea. Lieutenant-Commander John Quinn, Able Seaman Elburne Baikie (from Hamilton) and Able Seaman Wallis Burden were killed by an artillery attack and eight other sailors were wounded. Today, Ross Barr (originally from Hamilton) who served on HMCS IROQUOIS with Elburne Baikie will be receiving the “Ambassador for Peace Medal” from the Republic of Korea.

HMCS HAIDA served two tours of duty in Korean waters, 1952 and 1954 and it is the only destroyer left. She is also the only Tribal Class destroyer left in the World. HMCS HAIDA is one of the most famous ships in Canada and she is located in Hamilton harbour. Recently, HMCS HAIDA became the Royal Canadian Navy Flag Ship.
