The "Ambassador for Peace Medal" will be presented to S/Sgt. Joseph H Willson JR.

He served with the US 5th Air force HQ as a flight engineer. Unfortunately, he died in a fatal plane (Beech C-45 Expeditor) crash during the Korean War near Dague, Korea on February 8, 1951. He is from Miami, Florida and his family members are Canadians.

His nephew Commander(Ret'd) Richard Beresford served with the Royal Canadian Navy. His great nephew Sergeant(Ret'd) Anthony Beresford served with the RCN and Royal Canadian Air force. His Great niece Lt.(Ret'd) Ann Marie Beresford served with RCN. Their mother Lt.(Ret'd) Shirley Bresford served with the RCN as well. The family have been carrying a torch and the memory of him for many years. We will remember him.
