On November 16th, 2019 "The Korean War Veterans Appreciation Luncheon" was held at the Holiday Inn & Parkway Convention Centre in St. Catharines to honour and remember Canadian Korean War Veterans who fought during the Korean War (1950-1953) and the UN Peace Keeping Mission (1953-1955).

They served Canada proudly and helped to secure South Korea's Peace and Freedom saving many innocent lives including my parents. They are the true pioneers and heroes of Canada-Korea's diplomatic and economic relations (\$11 Billion Bilateral Trade) that has impacted largely in various sectors such as Defence, Education, Banking, Research, Science and Technology, Agriculture, Forestry, Fishery, Arts, Culture, Heritage, Tourism and Sports (The Republic of Korea hosted a successful 2018 Winter Olympics in South Korea on February 9 to 25, 2018).


