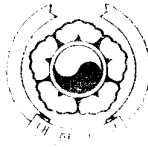

I give my best wishes for each of you. God bless America. God bless Korea.

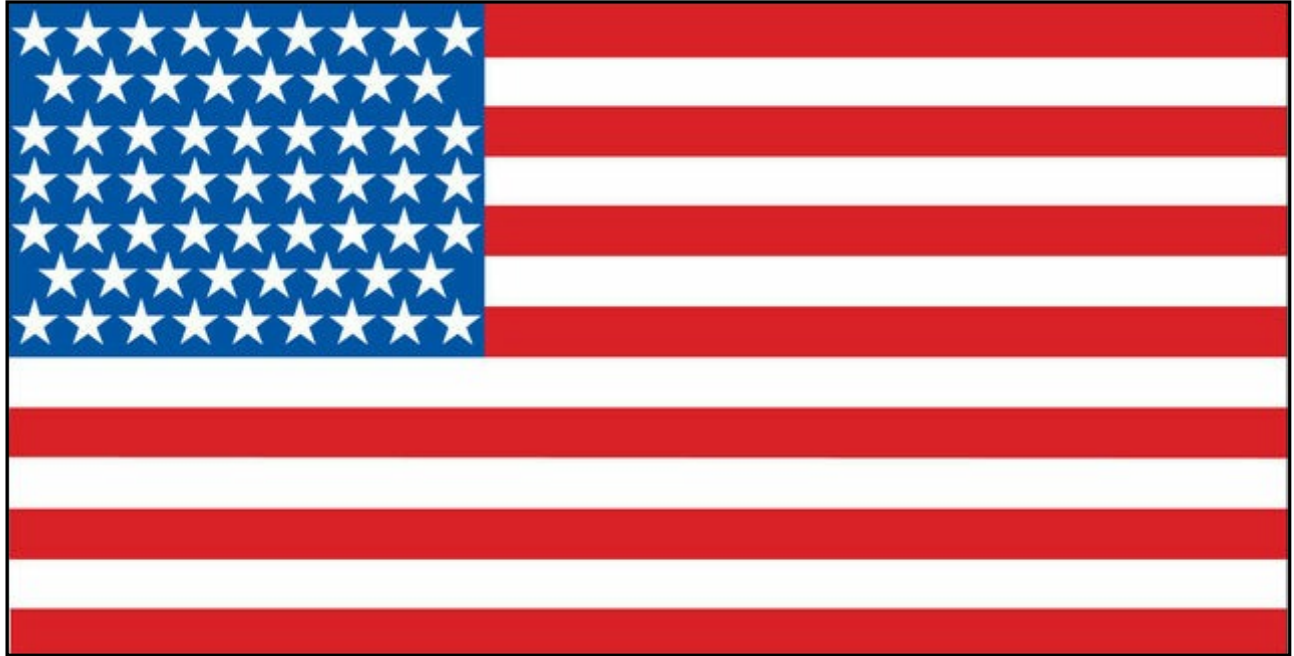
