On November 8th, 2018 "65th Anniversary of the Korean War Veterans Appreciation Luncheon" was held at the Michelangelo Banquet & Convention Centre to honour and remember Canadian Korean War Veterans who fought during the Korean War (1950-1953) and the UN Peace Keeping Mission (1953-1955).

They served Canada proudly and helped to secure South Korea's Peace and Freedom saving many innocent lives. Peace medals for Korean War vets Claude Gaudet and Russ Falshaw honoured at special luncheon

Russ Falshaw was speechless.

The 86-year-old Milton resident and Korean War veteran couldn't believe it when he got a phone call recently telling him he was going to receive an Ambassador for Peace Medal from the Consul General of the Republic of Korea (South Korea).

"I was so astounded that I would be considered for such an honour that I couldn't even talk, I had to pass the phone to my wife," said Falshaw, who received the medal from Consul General Tae-in Chung during a special luncheon at the Michelangelo Banquet Centre Nov. 8 to mark the 65th anniversary of the Korean War armistice.

The Korean War raged from 1950 to 1953, which ended with the country divided into the communist North and the American and United Nations-backed South.

Nearly 27,000 Canadians took part in the conflict, 516 were killed and 1,558 were wounded. Ninety-year-old Hamilton resident Claude Gaudet, who served in the Second World War and the Korean War, also received a peace medal from the Consul General.

An infantry soldier with the Royal Canadian Regiment, Gaudet said he was hit by shrapnel in his right leg, but a Korean doctor saved it.

"One of our doctors wanted to cut my leg off and a Korean doctor said 'no, no I can save that leg' so he operated on me and he saved it," Gaudet recalled.

Falshaw was a seaman on board HMCS Sioux that patrolled the east and west coasts of Korea and provided naval support during the Sept. 15 to 19, 1950 invasion of Inchon. "It was like a mini D-Day," Falshaw recalled.

The invasion involving 75,000 troops and 261 naval vessels was a decisive victory for the United Nations as it led to the recapture of the South Korean capital of Seoul. Falshaw called South Korea "a beautiful country and such wonderful people." For Canada the conflict in Korea has been called Canada's Forgotten War. But there was nothing forgotten about the Canadian men and women who served there at last week's luncheon that included about 150 people, including 28 Korean War vets and 56 family members of war vets.

"The people of Korea will never forget all they (the Canadian soldiers) have done for us," said Consul General Chung, who came in from Toronto for the event that was organized by the Korea Veterans Association of Canada Unit 26, Hamilton. "You are heroes to the Korean people; your legacy enriches us now and forever."

The luncheon's guest speaker, retired Canadian Lt.-Gen. Michel Maisonneuve, called the Korean conflict a war that was fought for freedom "in the snow, the mud and the cold."
