

Lt. Cdr John Quinn is also a WWII Veteran landed on D-Day in Juno beach, France. During the Korean War, he served on HMCS Iroquois and killed by enemy artillery attack along with Able Seaman Elburne Baikie from Hamilton, Ontario. His family will receive "Ambassador for Peace Medal", and Able Seaman Wallis Burden. Today, his son Charles Quinn, who lost his father at age 4, will be laying the wreath with Ross Barr (1952) and Michael Bladon (1954) who served on HMCS Iroquois.

His Citation:

1939-45 Star, France and Germany Star, Canadian Volunteer Service Medal and Clasp, War Medal 1939-45, Naval General Service Medal plus Palestine Clasp 1945-48, United Nations Service Medal (Korea) and the Korea Medal.
